Wings Over the Prairie Festival - Nov. 24-25

The 88th annual Wings Over the Prairie Festival and World's Championship Duck Calling Contest is set for Nov. 24-25 in Stuttgart. The largest outdoor expo in the Mid-South, the event spans six city blocks in downtown Stuttgart with designated areas for shopping, food, children's activities, a carnival and midway, a beer garden, duck calling contests and more. Downtown merchants are open for business during the festivities. The first National Duck Calling Contest was held on Main Street in Stuttgart on Nov. 24, 1936 in connection with the annual Arkansas Rice Carnival. Seventeen people entered and the grand prize was a hunting coat valued at \$6.60. Today, more than 65 contests across the United States are held to qualify competitors to come to Stuttgart on Thanksgiving weekend to vie for the title of World Champion. Today's winner receives a prize package worth more than \$25,000.



Arkansas Tourism Development Incentive Program

To encourage growth in Arkansas' outdoor recreation and tourism industries, the Tourism Development Incentive Program was introduced. To stimulate the expansion of these industries, economic incentives are offered to qualified private development projects in the form of sales and income tax credits. Since the intent, in part, is to generate additional tourist traffic to Arkansas, each proposed project must develop a marketing plan that targets at least 25% of its visitors from out of state, meet other requirements, and submit a completed application prior to incurring any project costs.

Arkansas' Katherine Andrews elected Chair of Confluence of States

The Confluence of States recently met at the Outdoor Economy Conference in Cherokee, North Carolina. The conference brought together over 600 outdoor industry leaders, advocates, business leaders, and stakeholders from across the country to collaborate on important issues facing the outdoor economy. The conference featured keynote speakers, panel discussions, and workshops focused on topics such as building vibrant outdoor communities, leveling up outdoor businesses, advancing inclusive and effective coalitions, and envisioning the future of the outdoor economy. Members of the Confluence of States also met with leaders of the Statewide Outdoor Business Alliance Network and members of the National Governors Association's Outdoor Recreation Learning Network. During the convening, Katherine Andrews, director of the Arkansas Office of Outdoor Recreation, was elected Chair of the Confluence of States Coalition for 2024. Carolann Ouellette, director of the Maine Office of Outdoor Recreation, was re-elected to serve as co-chair.

Arkansas Graveler

Registration opens Jan. 1, 2024 for the inaugural Arkansas Graveler, a six-day and approximately 340-mile gravel ride traversing Arkansas' most rural roads. The event will take place June 23-29, 2024. The Arkansas Graveler route winds through some of the most scenic, iconic rural roads of Arkansas, beginning in Fayetteville in the northwest corner and ending in Jonesboro, located in the northeast corner. Daily ride distances vary between 40-70 miles depending on the difficulty of the terrain. It is not a race, but rather a tour and cycling festival with an emphasis on live music, community activation, culinary focus, and outdoor experiences at each overnight stop, making the Arkansas Graveler more than a ride.

Eddyline Kayaks Relocates to Arkansas

Recreational kayak manufacturer Eddyline Kayaks is relocating its headquarters from Washington to downtown Siloam Springs in Northwest Arkansas and plans to complete the move before the end of the year.

WOKA Whitewater Park Now Open
